Balance Issues	Eyes (Vision Loss)	Face Drooping	Arm Weakness	Speech Difficulty	Time to Call 911

If any of these symptoms are present, seek medical help immediately.

Other Common Stroke Symptoms

Be on the lookout for the sudden onset of:

- Confusion, trouble speaking or understanding speech
- Numbness or weakness in the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- A severe headache with no known cause
